# 2019 Enrollment for MARKET LIVESTOCK PROJECTS

ALL Members are required to fill out a NEW 4-H/FFA Enrollment form, have all projects listed and all signatures in place and to the Extension office by **4:30 pm** on Monday, **April 15**. Market livestock projects cannot be added after the DEADLINE of APRIL 15. ALL original signatures and forms must be turned in by 4:30 pm April 15, 2019. No faxes or emailed copies will be accepted for livestock projects.



# **Poultry Orders**

All Poultry orders (market turkeys, chickens & ducks— ivory card) must be ordered and paid for by April 15.

# **Ohio Poultry Pullorum Update**

Ohio Department of Agriculture Division of Animal Health has announced that due to the fact there is no S. pullorum antigen available for testing, Ohio is waiving the S. pullorum testing requirement for the 2019 fair season. The exception to this waiver is out-of-state poultry that do not have a VS form 9-3. The VS form 9-3 signifies that the poultry are from a NPIP flock that is free of S. pullorum. Ohio is currently S. pullorum free. If you have questions, please contact Tony M. # 2019 Quality Assurance

**TEST-OUT OPTION**: Youth ages 12-14 and 15-18 may participate. The test will be offered after the QA sessions for any members who would like to participate.

# 2019 SKILLATHONS

Project judging and skillathons allow youth to demonstrate and review what they have worked on and learned throughout their project year. The 4-H Advisory Committee has determined this piece of the 4-H project process is important and is part of the requirements for 4-H membership. The 4-H Advisory Committee, Livestock Committees and Senior Fair Boards have determined that skillathons meet the criteria for project judging.

ALL livestock (market, dairy, breeding, fancy, and/ or horse) project members are *required* to participate in skillathons for *each* specie project they have enrolled in. Skillathons are *required* for all livestock and horse project participants in order to remain 4-H members in good standing and be eligible to exhibit, participate, show and/or sell their project animals at all three fairs. FFA youth taking hogs and/or Feeder calves should contact their FFA teacher for project requirements and eligibility. FFA Youth are *Required to participate in skillathons* for all animals sold at the Washington County Fair. To help this process and coordinate efforts of youth and volunteers *ALL* Skillathons will be offered:

# County Tag-in—Saturday, June 1

Required Tag-in for Market Lamb, Market Goat, Dairy Feeder Steer will be Saturday, June 1 from 8—10:00 am at the Washington County Fairgrounds.

Born, Bred, & Raised Award Cards are due June 1 Breed Award Cards are due June 1 (except market dairy goat—due July 20 and market rabbit—due Aug 3)

Note: Dairy Feeder exhibitors must turn in the Born, Bred, Raised card to verify the calf was purchased directly from a dairy farmer in Washington, Athens, Morgan, Monroe, Noble, Belmont, Guernsey, or Muskingum Counties.

Yellow card = Dairy Feeder Steer & Dairy Goat Blue card = Market Goat, Market Steer, Market Lamb and Market Rabbit

Washington County Fair – market steers and dairy feeders-must be hornless by tag-in and healed by fair; must wear neck rope and halter while in stall

- Barlow Fair new weigh-in schedule: 5-5:30 Mkt Dairy Goats & 5:30-8:00 – Feeder Calves
- Barlow Fair Skillathon required for all exhibitors (4-H & FFA)

### All Fairs

 Male Anatomy for market animals – Responsibility of parent and exhibitor – must be done and healed by tag-in

All Livestock Sale Orders – Champion, Reserve Champion, Premier Exhibitor, followed by order of placing from light to heavy

Market animal spares – Animals at tag-in are assigned and only the spare may be shared by brothers or sisters. Animals assigned to exhibitors at tag-in may not be switched at fair weigh-in. Spare animals are in case a project animal dies or does not make weight. This allows exhibitors to have a backup project animal
