2018 Enrollment for MARKET LIVESTOCK PROJECTS

ALL Members are required to fill out a NEW 4-H/FFA Enrollment form, have all projects listed and all signatures in place and to the Extension office by **5:00 pm** on Monday, **April 16**. Market livestock projects *cannot be added after the DEADLINE of APRIL 16*. ALL original signatures and forms must be turned in by 5:00 pm April 16, 2018. No faxes or emailed copies will be accepted for livestock projects.



Poultry Orders

All Poultry orders (market turkeys, chickens & ducks— ivory card) must be ordered and paid for by April 16.

Ohio Pullorium Testing School

Two schools (May 2 & May 3) are held in Ohio for people ages 18 and older interested in becoming pullorium testers. The Ohio Poultry Association (official state agency, NPPI) and the Ohio Department of Agriculture are combining efforts to organize Pullorium-Fowl Typhoid plate agglutination tester training classes. You must be 18 years of age to become a certified tester. There is a charge of \$50 per student to offset program costs. There is an additional \$5 fee for first time participants. Your certification is valid for 5 years. Email cfulton@ohiopoultry.org or call 614-882-6111 for more info.

2018 Quality Assurance

We are planning Three (3) QA sessions for the 2018 fair season. Please remember that QA is mandatory for all youth (taking market livestock and lactating dairy cattle/goat projects) and one parent/guardian to attend in order to be eligible to participate in junior fair events, shows and sales at the fairs.

New for 2018—Livestock Quality Assurance Training - Members may attend a QA session in any Ohio county, the member must still be accompanied by a parent

TEST-OUT OPTION: Youth ages 12-14 and 15-18 may participate. The test will be offered after the QA sessions for any members who would like to participate.

2018 SKILLATHONS

Project judging and skillathons allow youth to demonstrate and review what they have worked on and learned throughout their project year. The 4-H Advisory Committee has determined this piece of the 4-H project process is important and is part of the requirements for 4-H membership. The 4-H Advisory Committee, Livestock Committees and Senior Fair Boards have determined that skillathons meet the criteria for project judging.

ALL livestock (market, dairy, breeding, fancy, and/or horse) project members are **required** to participate in skillathons for **each** specie project they have enrolled in. Skillathons are **required** for all livestock and horse project participants in order to remain 4-H members in good standing and be eligible to exhibit, participate, show and/or sell their project animals at all three fairs. FFA youth taking hogs and/or Feeder calves should contact their FFA teacher for project requirements and eligibility. FFA Youth are **Required to participate in skillathons** for all animals sold at the Washington County Fair. To help this process and coordinate efforts of youth and volunteers **ALL** Skillathons will be offered:

Breed Award Cards are due June 2 (*except market dairy goat—due July 14 and market rabbit— due Aug 4*)

Note: Dairy Feeder exhibitors must turn in the Born, Bred, Raised card to verify the calf was purchased directly from a dairy farmer in Washington, Athens, Morgan, Monroe or Noble Counties. See Rules #18 and #25 in Jr Fair Guide for more specifics.

Washington County Fair Updates

- County fair livestock sale will be Tuesday, September 4 at 4:00 pm. New Sale order: turkeys, rabbits, goats, chickens, dairy feeders, market beef, lambs.
- County Fair Market Goats - Rule #18 Boer is the recommended breed, but not required. Rule #37- Goats may be dehorned but not required
- County Fair Weigh in times- Lambs, Goats & Dairy Feeder Steers weigh-in between 4pm-7pm. Market Beef weigh-in from 7pm-8pm.
- County Fair Market Lambs – Rule #27- 5% of market lambs sale price will be deducted for facility upkeep, advertising & misc expenses.
- County Fair – Rule #27- All Exhibitor checks will be mailed on or after November 1.
- County Fair Picture Times - Cattle barn Friday 6 – 8 pm. Rabbit/poultry barn Saturday from 11am-1pm. Cattle barn Saturday 1pm-4pm. Horse Barn 4pm-5pm
- County Fair Rule #31- Required to sell- Pen Set up and/or Tear down is required. Any exhibitor not signing out will forfeit 20% of their total sales

Waterford Fair Updates

- Hog tags for Waterford – 4-H or FFA advisors must contact Chris Campbell or the OSU Extension Office with number of tags needed for their club members and pick them up between April 15 - May 15. Otherwise hogs will be tagged on June 4, 6-7 pm at the Waterford Fairgrounds

Barlow Fair Updates

- Barlow livestock sale will be Saturday, September 29 at 5:30 pm. New Sale order: dairy goats, FC heifers, FC steers, ducks
- Barlow Fair premiums have been revised and simplified
- Barlow Market Dairy Goats – minimum weight is 50 pounds, Required Breed Verification Card due at July tag-in, Goats may be dehorned but not required
- Barlow Feeder Calf & Dairy Goat tag-in: New time - July 14, 8–10 am
 - Barlow Horses – once stalled the animal must remain on grounds until Sunday at 4 pm

- 5) Has not previously served as Junior Fair King or Junior Fair Queen of Washington County.
- 6) Prince, Junior Princess and Dairy Princess, Horse Princess may not run consecutive years for the same title.
- 7) **Entry fee is \$30.00. Make checks payable to Washington County 4-H Committee/Royalty.**




Ohio 4-H Conference

The Ohio 4-H Conference is the largest gathering of 4-H volunteers in the United States. The conference welcomes nearly 1,500 teen and adult volunteers to participate each year. The Ohio 4-H Conference is designed to equip participants with resources, information, and skills to meet the ever-changing needs of youth. Twelve youth and adults representing Washington County 4-H attended the conference on March 10 at the Columbus Convention Center.

The conference recognized Margaret Webster of Belpre with an Ohio 4-H Meritorious Service Award. The award recognizes volunteers for a lifetime of service and contributions to 4-H on the club, county or state level and serves as a positive influence in the lives of 4-H members. Webster's biggest contribution to the program in Washington County is the development of the 4-H Camp Counselor program while she served as Camp Director. She is beginning her 36th year as a 4-H volunteer and continues to be an active member of the Washington County 4-H Advisory Committee where she has served as President and currently serves as Secretary, Finance Sub-committee, and Home Economics Sub-committee. 4-H Project Books

It's time to get your 4-H Project Books and get an early start on your project year. Most projects, including animal projects require members to purchase a new project book each year. Rule of thumb—new animal = new book. However, keep in mind the livestock resource handbooks are a one-time purchase that can be used as a reference year after year. 4-H Enrollment Process

- Enrollment forms are due **April 16th by 5:00 pm**
- Faxed/emailed and/or forms without ALL signatures in place will NOT be accepted.
- **Enrollment forms also serve as the market livestock entry – so please double check projects!**
- **Market Goat vs Market Dairy Goat**—project members need to indicate on enrollment form by including the fair name next to project. However, only one record book is needed for multiple animals.

Ohio 4-H Age Guidelines

- Cloverbud Members must be at least 5 years old and in Kindergarten as of January 1, 2018
- 4-H Members must be at least 8 years old and enrolled in 3rd grade as of January 1, 2018



2018 Ohio 4-H Cloverbot Challenge

The 2018 4-H Cloverbot Challenge is out of this world! This year the focus is on space and learning more about the stars, planets, and galaxies that are part of our solar system and the universe beyond.

The Challenge

Cloverbot teams will research ways in which humans could live in space for extended periods and the challenges this presents:

- What mode of travel will you use?
- Where will you live – on the moon, another planet, a space station?
- What does your habitat look like?
- Where does your food come from and how do you maintain fresh food?
- How will the space travelers stay healthy?

Examine one or more of these questions and create a solution. Or have your team explore an original idea of their own. For example, the Bouncing Brutus 4-H Club wants to create a way to bus people to other planets for vacations. The challenges include a lack of gravity, the length of time it takes to travel from Earth, and providing food for travelers.

Explore

The challenge encourages Cloverbuds to explore all aspects of life in space:

- Breathing
- Eating
- Exercising
- Sleeping
- Plants and Animals
- Recreation

Challenge Guidelines

- ✓ Teams must have at least two, but no more than eight members. All participants must be 4-H Cloverbud members
- ✓ Models must be constructed in an area no larger than 15"x15". A baseplate is recommended, but not required
- ✓ Any type and quantity of interlocking bricks (ie. Mega Bloks, LEGOS) may be used
- ✓ Models must feature a moving part or simple machine (lever, wedge, incline, wheel and axle, pulley, screw).
- ✓ Poster must include team name and members' names. Use the poster to highlight the overall experience.
- ✓ Teams **must** be present at the Challenge on June 9, in order to receive a team certificate and individual medals.
