

Market Livestock

PLEASE BE SURE to review carefully the reminders and updates as well as the 2016 JUNIOR FAIR ACTIVITIES GUIDE. There are several updates/changes for each of the fairs.

2016 Enrollment for MARKET LIVESTOCK PROJECTS

ALL Members are required to fill out a NEW 4-H/FFA Enrollment form, have all projects listed and all signatures in place and to the Extension office by 5:00 pm on Wednesday, April 15. Market livestock projects cannot be added after the DEADLINE of APRIL 15. ALL original signatures and forms must be turned in by 5:00 pm April 15, 2016. No faxes or emailed copies will be accepted for livestock projects.

All Poultry orders (market turkeys, chickens & ducks) must be ordered and paid for by April 15.

2016 Quality Assurance

We are planning Three (3) QA sessions for the 2016 fair season. Please remember that QA is mandatory for all youth (taking market livestock and lactating dairy cattle/goat projects) and one parent/guardian to attend in order to be eligible to participate in junior fair events, shows and sales at the fairs.

March 17 - Fort Frye High School, 7-9 pm April 20 - Warren High School, 7-9 pm May 11 - Frontier High School, 7-9 pm

TEST-OUT OPTION: Youth ages 12-14 and 15-18 may participate. The test will be offered after the QA sessions for any members who would like to participate. The test is 50 questions and you must pass with 70%. There are a limited number of tests available. If you are interested in taking the test please call the Extension Office to reserve a space after the QA session.

2016 SKILLATHONS

Project judging and skillathons allow youth to demonstrate and review what they have worked on and learned throughout their project year. The 4-H Advisory Committee has determined this piece of the 4-H project process is important and is part of the requirements for 4 -H membership. The 4-H Advisory Committee, Livestock Committees and Senior Fair Boards have determined that skillathons meet the criteria for project judging. ALL livestock (market, dairy, breeding, fancy, and/ or horse) project members are *required* to participate in skillathons for **each** specie project they have enrolled in. Skillathons are *required* for all livestock and horse project participants in order to remain 4-H members in good standing and be eligible to exhibit, participate, show and/ or sell their project animals at all three fairs. FFA youth taking hogs and/or Feeder calves should contact their

FFA teacher for project requirements and eligibility. FFA Youth are *Required to participate in skillathons* for all animals sold at the Washington County Fair. To help this process and coordinate efforts of youth and volunteers *ALL* Skillathons will be offered:

Saturday August 6, 2016

8:30-11:30 - hogs, goats, lambs, rabbits (except pet rabbit);

12:30-3:30 - beef, dairy, poultry, horse (except horseless horse)

Make-up days: August 8 and 9 (noon-7:00 pm)
(limited space, calling to reserve an appointment is required--no
make-up times will be available before August 8)



Market Livestock

<u>Tips for Selecting & Caring for Your 4-</u> H Project Animals

- Always purchase from a reliable source. Ask the producer what vaccinations/wormers have been given, what feed the animal is currently on, pedigree or breeding information, records they keep on their animals, etc.
- Select animals that look HEALTHY! That means they are alert, active, social, walk freely and display no signs of physical defects or illness.
- 3) Look for animals that meet or exceed breed standards and characteristics. Especially important for dairy females & feeders, breeding rabbits, production poultry, production & dairy goats & market hogs for the breed show.
- 4) Purchase animals that are the right age and starting weight to meet desirable market weights. 2016 Fair Weight Requirements:
 - *Hogs 220-280 lbs.
 - *Market Beef-not less than 1000 lbs.
 - *Dairy Feeder 450-650 lbs.
 - * Lambs 100-140 lbs.
 - *Goats 60-120 lbs.
 - *Rabbits 3-5 lbs. per rabbit
 - *Chickens-min.of 3½ lb. per bird
 - *Turkeys min. of 16 lbs.
 - *Feeder Calves 350-700 lbs.
 - *Market Dairy Goat min. of 60 lbs.
 - *Market Ducks min. of 6 lb. per bird
- 5) Observe Animals Daily An animal project is a big investment & responsibility. Get to know your animal to notice changes in behavior, appetite, fecal content, urine output, breathing, signs of illness, etc. Consult with your veterinarian for any treatment decisions!
- 6) Provide Proper Animal Care:
 - Spending a lot of money on an animal or buying the best genetics does not guarantee a champion. Animals will not perform well if they are not cared for properly!
 Provide plenty of CLEAN, FRESH WATER at all times. Animals prefer warmer water in cool weather and cooler water in hot weather.
 - √ Feed an appropriate diet, in the right amounts at regular times daily. Weigh your animal to monitor performance and adjust diet as needed.
 - ✓ Provide shelter from the weather that is dry and well ventilated.
 - √ Keep animals and facilities clean.
 - √Utilizing good bio-security practices to protect you and your animal.

Cloverbud Corner



Teaching Respect and Manners

Teaching respect and manners helps Cloverbuds understand that other people are important and deserve consideration. Below are some ideas for how to work these lessons into a Cloverbud 4-H meeting.

- ▶ Before serving a snack, talk to the youth about what manners are expected like waiting their turn to be served and asking politely for seconds. Give examples of what to do such as asking, "May I please have more juice?" or saying "Thank you for the snack." While they eat, offer reminders when they do not show manners.
- ▶ Most 4-H clubs meet in the homes of members or in community buildings. Provide materials for the Cloverbuds to make their own thank you cards to say thanks for the use of the building. If possible, allow the children to present the thank you notes themselves.
- ▶ Being able to speak to adults can be challenging for Cloverbud age children. Letting them practice what author, June Hines Moore, calls the Six S's can help make this easier (Moore, 2001). Cloverbuds can practice with each other or ask other adults to help them practice.
- * Stand Stand when you meet someone for the first time
- * Smile Look in a mirror, smile and say, "Hello, how are you?"
- * See their eyes Look people in the eye when meeting them
- * Shake their hand When meeting people it is appropriate to shake hands.
- * Say your name Say "Hello, my name is ______."
- * Say their name back to them It is nice to meet you
- ► There are a few other courtesies youth can be reminded about:
- * Opening doors for others is always kind.
- * It is polite to wait until others are done talking before you speak. It is not polite to interrupt.
- * Saying "I'm sorry" shows you care about others.
