Annual 4-H Club Advisor Training

Our annual club advisor training will be Saturday, February 11 from 8:30 am – noon at the Christ United Methodist Church, 3rd & Wooster St., Marietta. At least one volunteer per club must attend.

The agenda includes: sessions for club advisors and Cloverbud leaders, program updates, child abuse prevention, award form training, iron chef clinic, youth leadership opportunities, and fair updates.

4-H Enrollment Process

- Clubs should have the first face-to-face club meeting by mid-March
- Enrollment forms are due April 14th by 5:00 pm
- Faxed/emailed and/or forms without ALL signatures in place will NOT be accepted
- Enrollment forms also serve as the market livestock entry – so please double check projects!



Ohio 4-H Age Guidelines

- Cloverbud Members must be at least 5 years old and in Kindergarten as of January 1, 2017
- 4-H Members must be at least 8 years old and enrolled in 3rd grade as of January 1, 2017

Volunteer Background Checks – every 4 years

OSU Extension policy requires 4-H volunteers to have a background check (Ohio BCI) every four years. Notices have been sent to volunteers due for a re-check in 2017. BCI checks can be done locally at the Sheriff's Office, Ohio Valley Education Service Center, or Warren Local School Board. If you would like to be reimbursed for the cost of your background check, keep your original receipt and bring it to the Extension Office with a reimbursement form.

New 4-H Volunteers

If you are recruiting new 4-H volunteers keep in mind they must schedule an interview with Bruce or Kathryn to begin the process. The 4-H volunteer application will be given out at the interview. All new volunteers must attend New Volunteer Orientation. Our next training will be <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>April 25</u> at the Extension Office at 7:00 pm.

Fair Changes

Waterford, County & Barlow Changes/Updates

Here a few changes for the 2017 fair season. Each of these changed are noted in the Jr Fair Guide:

- Market rabbits for county fair can be purchased rather than owning the doe and breeding for market rabbits
- Dairy Beef Feeders for county fair can now weigh 350-700
- Hog tags for Waterford 4-H or FFA advisors must contact Chris Campbell or the OSU Extension Office with number of tags needed for their club members and pick them up between May 14-20
- Market Duck for Barlow are now a minimum of weight of 4.5 pounds each

Giving your Cloverbuds the opportunity to interact across generations is a great experience for both your members and the seniors they are visiting! Here is an activity that gives your Cloverbuds a chance to be creative while making a special Valentine's Day bookmark to share with seniors. Arrange for the Cloverbuds to visit and deliver their special gifts to a local nursing home, senior center or senior housing.

Begin the meeting by talking about Valentine's Day. When we think of Valentine's Day we think of love. One of the ways we show love is to be kind to others. Today we are going to make a Valentine's Day gift and share it with some of our local senior citizens. You may go on to explain what the plan is for your visit with your local seniors.

Supplies needed to make the bookmark:

Templates – bookmark and heart (provided on page 3) (Hint: Cut templates from card stock or poster board for ease in tracing).

Card stock – use for the bookmark

Paper for hearts – use scrapbooking paper, heavy wrapping paper or construction paper. (If you want to allow the Cloverbuds to decorate their hearts then choose a plain paper with no patterns).
