

- All Livestock Sale Orders Champion, Reserve Champion, Premier Exhibitor, followed by order of placing from light to heavy
- Market animal spares Animals at tag-in are assigned and only the spare may be shared by brothers or sisters. Animals assigned to exhibitors at tag-in may not be switched at fair weigh-in. Spare animals are in case a project animal dies or does not make weight. This allows exhibitors to have a backup project animal
