



# So you want to take a Market Duck

*Exhibitors are responsible to read and comply with all rules from ODA, Senior Fair Boards and Livestock Committees*



**Enrollment Due: April 1<sup>st</sup>**

**Project Book:**

#150DM Market Duck (1<sup>st</sup> year members), or Washington County Livestock Record Book (2<sup>nd</sup> year members and beyond), FFA exhibitors see your advisor for requirements.  
**ALL project books must be in print form and required for skillathon.**

**Bird Orders**

Poultry order is not guaranteed and is pending availability, through approved hatchery. Birds are ordered through OSU Extension Office.

**Project Animal Requirements:**

- \*Orders must be placed and paid for by April 15
- \*Maximum of 6 ducks per exhibitor can be ordered
- \*Pens will consist of 2 ducks
- \*Only drakes ordered, exhibitors not penalized for hens sent
- \*Possession: From time of pick-up (mid – July)
- \*Fair weight limits: Min. 4.5# NO maximum weight

**Pre-Fair Tag-In:**

NONE – exhibitors will be notified for pick-up of ducks

**Quality Assurance:**

*Exhibitor and one parent/guardian **must** attend one of the sessions offered in Washington County or any other Ohio County. Test-out options are available for older youth. See **Important Market Livestock Dates in the Junior Fair Activities Guide available at the Extension Office or online at <http://washington.osu.edu> for dates, times and locations.***

**Skillathon:**

*Skillathon is **required** for exhibitor to be eligible to show and/or sell at the fair. See **Important Market Livestock Dates in the Junior Fair Activities Guide or 4-H Calendar available at the Extension Office or online at <http://washington.osu.edu> for dates, times and locations.***

**Fair:**

Barlow Fair

**Pen Reservations Due:**

Pen reservation information for market animals will be collected at skillathon.

**What happens at the Fair?**

<b>Check in</b>	4-8:00 pm-Wednesday (completed online DUNF is required before animals cross the scales) Birds must be washed clean and dried before crossing the scales.
<b>Buyer Thank you posters</b>	Make a Thank You poster to thank previous buyer. Hang it in the barn. See Jr Fair Guide for details and size.
<b>Classes</b>	To be eligible to <b>SELL</b> , exhibitor <b>must do both</b> Showmanship and Market Classes.
<b>Judging</b>	Thursday 5:30pm Showmanship / Friday 9am Market classes
<b>Pictures</b>	Are required to sell, See Junior Fair Guide for all picture times.
<b>What is the Premier Exhibitor Award?</b>	High scoring exhibitor from skillathon (100 points), showmanship (100 points) & market class placing (50 points)
<b>Sale</b>	Saturday 5:00PM, <b>See Junior Fair Activities Guide for sale order and time and location</b>
<b>Thank/contact buyers</b>	Thank buyers by note, call or in person at their business after the fair.
<b>Sale Checks</b>	Checks are mailed directly to exhibitors after payment from buyers has been made. If you have questions about your checks call Barlow Senior Fair Board.

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# Market Poultry Basics

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What to look for and do the day birds arrive:

Check beaks - they are trimmed before shipping if too short they will have trouble eating

Legs and toes should be straight with no deformities

Birds should be alert and active

Be sure to bring water with you. Birds are shipped soon after they are born.

When you bring them home:

Add electrolytes to water. (can be found at any feed store)

Teach birds to drink by gently dipping their beaks in water source

Feeding the proper type of feed at the correct age is important:

- Turkeys - starter mash
- Chickens – broiler starter ration
- Ducks – starter mash for first four weeks (22 – 24% protein), then switch to 20% protein finisher - do not use medicated feeds

Do not use stale, spoiled or moldy feed

Make sure birds have plenty of fresh feed and water at all times

Facilities for healthy growth:

Birds need to be kept warm and dry

Ventilation and sanitation are very important

Room to move and exercise must be available

Protection from weather, disease and predators is necessary

As they grow:

Facility area needs to grow with growing birds

Ventilation and sanitation should be top priorities

Some good bedding choices are: wood shavings, ground corn cobs or rice hulls and straw

Going to the fair:

Review project books to help you select birds for the fair

Review the Junior Fair Activities Guide for rules, dates, times and locations of all fair events

Make sure your birds are clean for the fair and throughout the fair

Exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their birds throughout the day each day of the fair.
