Washington County Junior Fair Royalty Code of Conduct

Introduction Statement:

This Junior Fair Royalty Code of Conduct is to be followed by anyone who enters the Washington County Junior Fair Royalty Contest. As an applicant, you are a representative of Washington County's Junior Fair Program, which includes 4-H, FFA, FCCLA, Boy Scouts of America, and Girl Scouts. These organizations actively participate in the Barlow Independent, Washington County and Waterford Community Fairs.

Expectations of Junior Fair Royalty Candidates and Royalty Winners:

- Wear the given attire (hat/crown, sash/pin) when appropriate.(Attire may NOT be worn when exhibiting or selling livestock.)
- Conduct yourself in a courteous, respectful and professional manner.
- > Dress appropriately at all times. (Inappropriate dress for females includes: spaghetti straps, strapless or off the shoulder dresses or tops, tube tops, clothing that exposes any part of the midriff or cleavage, old or worn looking jeans; dresses, skorts, skirts, shorts shorter than 4" above the knee; or undergarments showing. Males may not wear old or worn looking jeans, slacks or shorts, torn or holey shirts, clothing that expose midriff or underwear.) No flip-flops!
- Use appropriate language at all times.
- Represent Washington County's Junior Fair Program as a positive role model.
- ➤ Abide by the decisions of the Washington County Junior Fair Royalty Committee.

Examples of Behavior and Conduct NOT permitted – including, but not limited to:

- Inappropriate language and gestures
- Not participating in Fair events
- Blatant disrespect for adults, volunteers, staff and/or those who are in a leadership position
- > Belittling others; putting others down and being disrespectful of individual differences
- Continual disregard of the Junior Fair Royalty Committee
- Inappropriate postings/pictures on social media (it may be reviewed)
- Other conduct determined to be inappropriate by the Junior Fair Royalty Committee

Actions that will be taken if violation(s) occur:

If any member of the Washington County Junior Fair Royalty Committee feels that any action taken by a Junior Fair Royalty representative is in violation of this Code of Conduct, that member may contact the other committee members to discuss what, if any, action should be taken. Actions may range from verbal warnings and discussions to removal of title, crown, sash, privileges and recognition.

Statement of Agreement for Candidate:

I have read the Junior Fair Royalty Contest Code of Conduct and agree to abide by it. I accept all consequences if I chose not to follow the Junior Fair Royalty Code of Conduct. INTERVIEWS, PUBLIC SPEAKING & CROWNING EVENT: Monday, August 12, 2024 – (Time & Location TBA)

REQUIREMENTS:

- 1) A member of a Junior Fair youth organization in Washington County
- 2) Candidates must be a Junior Fair Exhibitor at a Washington County Fair
- 3) Queen (16-19 but no older than 19 as of January 1, 2024). King (16-19 as of January 1, 2024). Junior Princess (12-15 as of January 1, 2024). Prince, Dairy Princess, & Horse Princess (12-15 as of January 1, 2024).
- 4) Contestants may not be married, nor have been married, nor borne or fathered a child, or be with child.
- 6) Contestant has not previously served as Junior Fair King or Junior Fair Queen of Washington County.
- 7) Prince, Junior Princess, Dairy and Horse Princess may not run consecutive years for the same title.
- 8) Contestants can only enter one Royalty Category in the same year.
- 9) Entry fee is \$30.00 (fee is non-refundable). Make checks payable to Washington County 4-H Committee/Royalty.

All schools, youth organizations and civic organizations are invited to encourage candidates to enter the contest. Eligible Junior Fair organizations include 4-H, Girl Scouts, Boy Scouts, FCCLA, and FFA.

RESPONSIBILITIES OF CANDIDATES:

1) Participate in Contest Interviews, Public Speaking & Crowning Event – Monday, August 12, 2024 – Interviews, Public Speaking, and Crowning will be held at a location to be announced. Each candidate will be interviewed by a minimum of two judges. The interview will last approximately 10 minutes. The public speaking event will include candidates introducing themselves and responding to impromptu questions. (Time TBA)

RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ROYALTY: The Royalty will reign for one year as soon as they are crowned.

Royalty will actively and fully participate for the duration of the Waterford Community Fair, Washington County Fair and Barlow Independent Fair for 2024 as well as the 4-H Year End Celebration held in November 2024.

- 1) Ride in the Waterford Community Fair Parade, Washington County Fair Parade, and Barlow Independent Fair Parade. Royalty is responsible for making their arrangements for transportation in the parades. Transportation arrangements must be approved by the Junior Fair Royalty Committee. All royalty members must ride on the royalty float unless approved in advance by the committee.
- 2) Junior Fair Royalty may ride in additional parades and are encouraged to participate at their own discretion. Royalty Court members must notify the Royalty Committee of additional parades scheduled and transportation arrangements.
- 3) Attend the following events at the Waterford Community Fair (August 15-18, 2024): Hog Show Friday, August 16, 2024; Buyer Appreciation Reception (welcome buyers) and Sale on Saturday, August 17, 2024. You should also make an appearance on Sunday, August 18, 2024.
- 4) Washington County Fair (August 31- September 3, 2024): Distribute ribbons and awards at activities, as scheduled, <u>everyday</u> of the Washington County Fair. Attend Buyer Appreciation Reception (welcome buyers) and Livestock Sale. Royalty is responsible for the Royalty fair booth display located in the Junior fair building
- 5) Attend the following events at the Barlow Independent Fair (September 26-29, 2024): Little Miss and Mr. Contest on Saturday, September 28, 2024; and Buyer Appreciation Reception (welcome buyers) and Livestock Sale on Saturday, September 28, 2024. Distribute ribbons and awards at activities and shows as scheduled, everyday. Royalty is responsible for the Royalty fair booth display.
- 6) Attend the 4-H Year End Celebration held on November 21, 2024. Royalty will be asked to assist with the awards program and expected to be in Sunday "Best" Dress with Sash and Crown. Royalty must be available 30 minutes prior to the event and remain until the conclusion of the program.
- 7) Royalty members may be asked to attend the 4-H Open House held in March, the 4-H Endowment Dinner in April, and other events as requested by the Royalty Committee.
- 8) Fall 2024 Attend annual banquets of FFA, FCCLA, 4-H, Boy Scouts and Girl Scouts as invited.
- 9) Royalty Members are encouraged to attend additional fairs across Ohio representing Washington County Junior Fair. Royalty members are responsible for their own transportation.
- 10) Queen Only January 2025 Represent Washington County at the Ohio Fair's Queen Contest at the Ohio Fair Managers Convention. You may request help with the application fee from the three fair boards.
- 11) Queen and King Only present a "Farewell Speech" at the 2025 Junior Fair Royalty Contest and officially crown the new royalty.

For interviews and crowning, candidates should wear appropriate attire such as Sunday "best". Please check Washington County Junior Fair Royalty Code of Conduct for inappropriate attire.

WASHINGTON COUNTY JUNIOR FAIR ROYALTY SCHOLARSHIP RULES

In an effort to recognize the quality youth of Washington County, and to help those interested in furthering their education, the Waterford Community, Washington County and Barlow Independent Fairs have established the Washington County Junior Fair King and Queen Scholarships. The scholarship program will be effective for the county fair queens selected in 1995 and thereafter and the kings selected in 1999 and thereafter. This scholarship will be a **one-time award** to each eligible recipient in the amount of \$500.

The purpose of this scholarship is to assist high school graduates who are continuing their education at any accredited college, university, or technical school in any course of study.

CONDITIONS GOVERNING SCHOLARSHIP

The scholarship will be awarded to the young adults chosen to be the Washington County Junior Fair King and Queen, who must meet all the selection criteria during his/her one-year reign.

The scholarship can be applied to educational expenses incurred at any accredited college, university, or technical school in any course of study.

To claim the Jr. Fair Royalty Scholarship, the recipient must submit evidence that:

- a) he/she has completed one year of full time instruction (as designated by the academic institution),
- b) he/she has maintained a G.P.A. of a C (2.0 on a 4.0 system), and
- c) he/she has completed the one year of full time instruction within two years of high school graduation.

Once this evidence has been received in the Washington County Office of the Ohio State University Extension, presentation of the funds can be made to the recipient.

FORFEITURE OF THE SCHOLARSHIP

Failure to continue his/her education after high school, failure to carry a full time set of classes, failure to maintain a C average and/or failure to complete the one year of full time classes within two years post-high school graduation will result in forfeiture of the scholarship.
